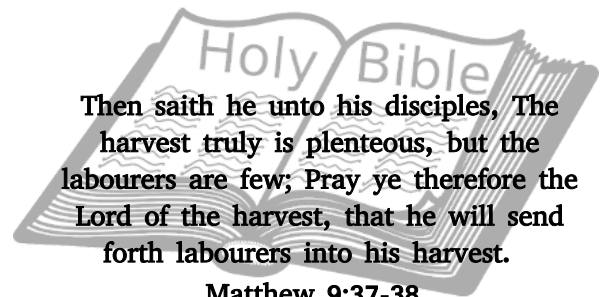

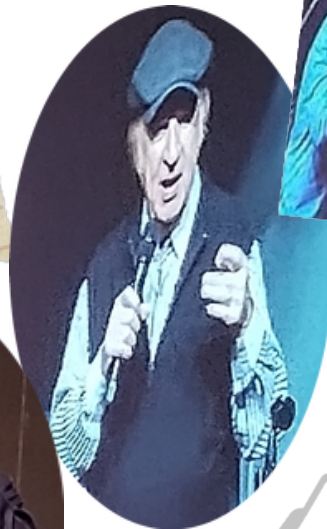
Every February, the Southern Baptist of Texas Convention hosts an evangelistic conference in Irving. The conference this year was held on February 26-27. This year's special speakers included David Jeremiah, Jeremiah Johnston, and many others. I've been to many conferences over the years, but this was the first Empower Conference that I have been to. In my opinion, it was the most enjoyable conference I have attended. The preaching was fabulous. David Jeremiah, a well-known Christian author and pastor, was the keynote speaker on Monday afternoon. He has suffered from a debilitating disease in the last year; so it was a blessing to be able to see him still preaching, even if it was from a chair. He admonished us to "Stay Holy, Healthy, Humble & Hungry." Jeremiah Johnston, who is also a Christian author, specializing in Apologetics, was one of the speakers on Tuesday morning. He spoke on the evidences of a bodily resurrection of Christ, and presented a video tour and various artifacts from Israel.

The music was really uplifting. The Gaither Vocal Band led us in worship on Monday afternoon, which for me, was a highlight of the whole conference. Many people don't realize that Bill & Gloria Gaither wrote quite a few of the songs in our hymnal, such as "Let's Just Praise the Lord," "I Believe in a Hill Called Mount Calvary," "There's Just Something About That Name," and the one song we sing every Wednesday night at the close of service, "The Family of God." It was really fun to see the Gaither Vocal Band in person after so many years of singing their songs. I got to hear some of my old time favorites: "The King Is Coming" and "Because He Lives," performed by the songwriter, Bill Gaither. I had never heard the Gaithers sing in person, so for me, this was a once in a lifetime opportunity, as Bill Gaither is becoming older and might not be traveling as much in the future. Bill Gaither is celebrating his 88th birthday at the end of March, and we all sang "Happy Birthday" to him.

- Wait Victoriously (v. 14)--- put on Christ, make no provision for the flesh

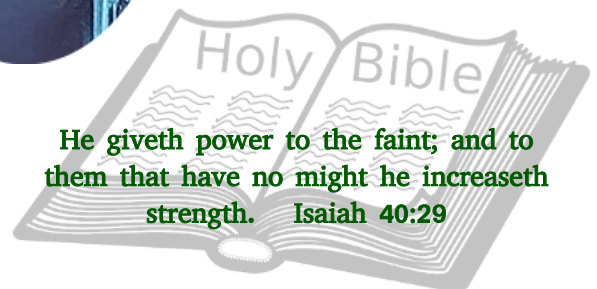

Nursing Home Ministry

Unexpected Window of Opportunity

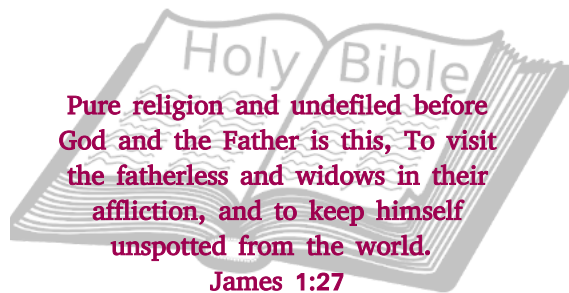
Sometimes God opens a window of opportunity at a most unexpected time, and when we climb through, we find a blessing awaits. A small little Bible study at Paradigm at Kountze (formerly known as Kountze Nursing Center) is that blessing to me. The number is small and fluctuating, but the people have captured my heart.



The core group consists of four faithful members, but the number grows between 10 and 15 each week as residents drift in and stay to listen. In fact, we even have nurses and CNAs who occasionally stop by and listen for a time.

The need for hope in that facility is great. Many of the residents have mostly been abandoned by family, and suffer rejection and loneliness. Some grapple with devastating diseases, such as dementia or cancer. Others are trapped by failing bodies. Yet, despite these struggles, our small little Bible study group is putting their faith in Jesus and reaching out for the hope He gives. Those who can, encourage each other and share their hope with other residents.

Windows of opportunity abound in this nursing home. Jesus tells us that when we visit the sick, we visit Him (Matthew 25), and the majority of these residents are in desperate need of people who would sacrifice a few hours of their time to visit with them, speak to them about Jesus, and encourage them. Who knows, maybe like me, one of these windows may be calling out to you.

Ghana Gala

On February 24, our church hosted the annual Ghana Gala for the third year in a row. This event is an annual fundraiser for Therefore International, a mission organization that focuses on missions in Ghana, Africa. The purpose of this year's gala was to raise \$45,000 for a new or slightly used Subaru Outback that would enable them to minister in remote places. They divided the amount of miles they expect to get out of this vehicle (300,000 mi) by the various ministry areas in which it would be used. Our mission committee recommended to pledge \$3,150 to go toward evangelism out of our designated missions funds for this event. The church also set a goal of \$1,125 from donations to go toward Bible distribution. Together, this would represent 28,500 miles of their ministry.

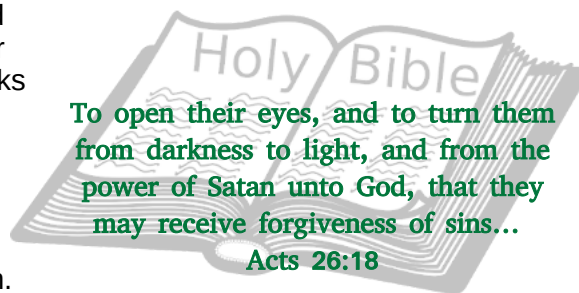

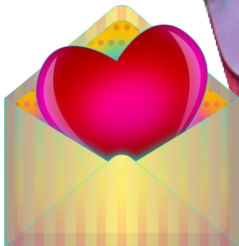
Armor Academy

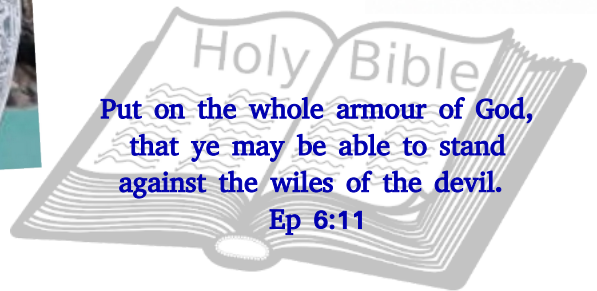

Over the years, I have been working to develop a game that would be fun for the kids on Resurrection Day, but would also place the focus on what the holiday is really about: Christ and his death, burial, and resurrection. I have actually been developing this game for the last fifteen years or so, and it is constantly evolving as I add more items for the kids to "hunt." Rather than eggs, which has nothing to do with Christ, the kids search for rocks with Scripture references on them... because Jesus is the Rock of our salvation. All the passages have to do with Jesus being the Rock, with a few passages included concerning the rocks during the crucifixion and resurrections (i.e. when the rocks rent at his death and the stone rolled away from the tomb). A few of the rocks spell out J-E-S-U-S, to really bring home the fact that Jesus IS the Rock. There are also other items besides the rocks that they hunt for: 3 crosses; 3 nails; vials of oil, vinegar, and water; a sponge; dice; 30 silver coins; cloths of purple, red, and white; and a crown of thorns. After, the kids find all the items, we then sit down and discuss each one and show them what the Bible says about each item. Then, they get to trade the items for some candy...that way they can take something home!

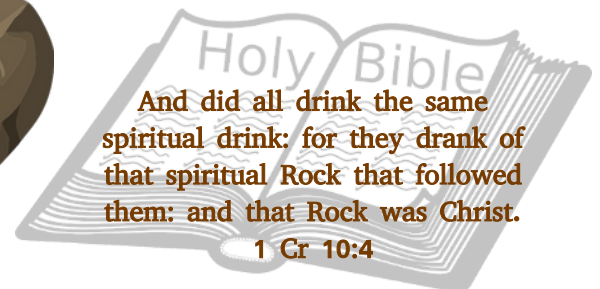

Praising God for a new record of shoebox gifts in 2023!

The numbers are in! Join us in praising God for 11,330,126 shoebox gifts collected worldwide in 2023, and 10,051,570 in the U.S., the most that have ever been packed and donated nationwide. Each of the 11,330,126 shoeboxes represents a child and a Gospel opportunity made possible through your partnership in ministry.

Our Big Thicket Area collected 7,740 shoebox gifts, and our FBC family packed 534 shoeboxes. For March, and probably April, FBC will collect items to pack 250 pencil pouches. We need 208 scissors, 100 large erasers, 140 boxes of crayons, 435 pens, and 500 pencils. There is a large box for these items near the nursery entrance. Feel free to collect any other shoebox items you find on sale. We will schedule a time for us to get together and get these pencil pouches packed after items are received. Be on the lookout for a time and date for this in the church bulletin in the next few weeks.

Millions of these children will go on to complete *The Greatest Journey* discipleship program, learning from faithful Ministry Partners in their region about how to follow Christ and share the Gospel with friends and family. Over 2.9 million children came to Christ through *The Greatest Journey* in 2023.

Please continue to pray with us. We are asking God to open the hearts of these children and their families to receive the Gospel in faith. Please also pray for the Ministry Partners who will be leading outreach events and teaching discipleship classes throughout the year. We eagerly anticipate seeing how God will advance His Kingdom through these shoebox gifts this year. It is a privilege to serve alongside you in this ministry.

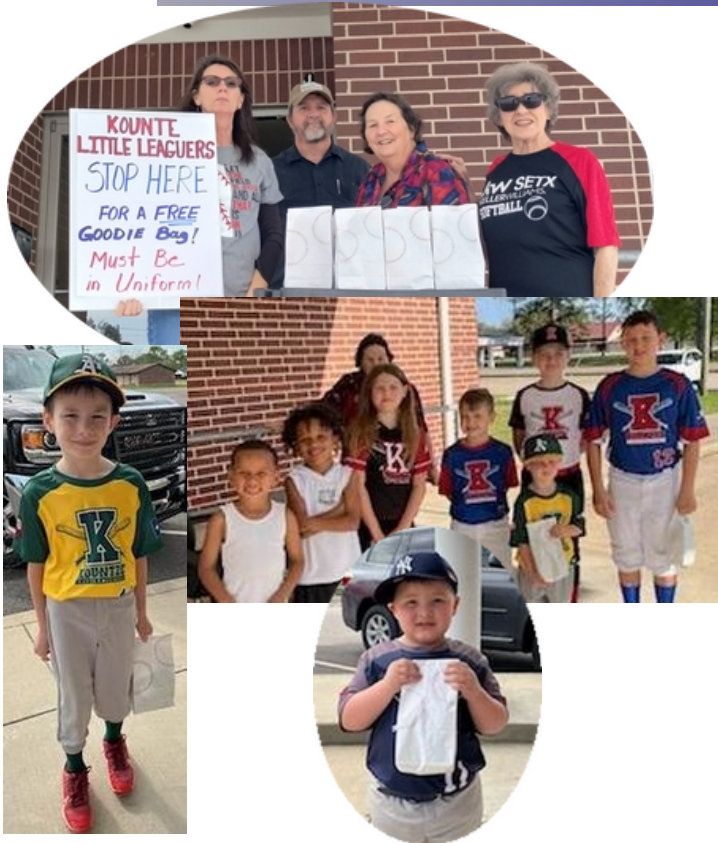

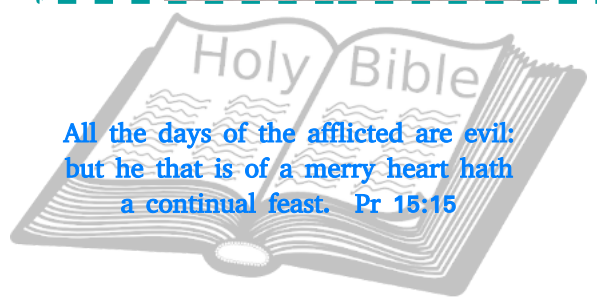


TOMFOOLERY
